## THE JUDGEMENT HEARING OF SAME SEX MARRIAGE

The long awaited verdict on marriage equality, which came on October 17th, where Supreme Court apart from ampathising on the basic needs & societal tolerance towards the community, it had outrightly had said NO to marriage equality, NO to civil unions, NO to adoptions.

The Supreme Court only confirmed Trans rights which they already had of Trans men legally marrying transwomen or cisgender women. Similarly, transwomen can legally marry transgender or cisgender men.

On the other hand, Trans non- binary persons cannot legally marry or have a legal civil union. Similarly, lesbian, gay, bi- sexual, pansexual, asexual, queer, cannot legally register a marriage or civil union.

Finally it was stated by the court that it was only for the parliament & state legislatures to create such institutions and grant legal validation for

the same sex marriage.

On the other hand Advocate Divan very rightly pointed out that it was a writing on the wall that the marriage equality would have never got granted, firstly the fight for this equality and wanting a judgement for the same happened too soon after decriminalization of 2018, according to him the petitioners should have waited for few years more before demanding for marriage equality.
