

The LGBTQI+ Health recent held PGIMER Conference, at Chandigarh from September 26th to 28th, 2024, marked a significant milestone in promoting healthcare for LGBTQI+ individuals across the Asia-Pacific region. Organized by PGIMER in collaboration with Humsafar Trust, C-SHaRP, PEPFAR, USAID, UNAIDS, and brought UNDP, the conference together in-person over 200 attendees, including 50 from Asianations, and Pacific 500 virtual participants.

Experts addressed critical health issues, including HIV prevention, mental health, and gender-affirmative care. Radhika Chakravarthy presented the Ayushman Bharat TG Plus card, providing yearly health coverage for transgender individuals. Other notable speakers included Dr. Niraj Kumar, Mr. Nicky Suwandini, and UNAIDS Director Eamonn Murphy.



Mist LGBTQI+ Foundation played a vital role in the conference's success, managing logistics, displaying ongoing initiatives through poster presentations, and ensuring sessions ran smoothly. Their joint efforts with Humsafar Trust and PGIMER guaranteed a seamless and rewarding experience for all attendees.




TransMHPrep: Forging Trans-Inclusive Psychosocial Care in Public Health Emergencies

The COVID-19 pandemic exacerbated vulnerabilities of the trans and gender-diverse (TGD) community, prompting Sangath Bhopal Hub's TransMHPrep initiative. Aiming to develop transresponsive best practices for psychosocial care, a consultation was held at Mumbai's YMCA International House. Fifty attendees, including TGD individuals, social workers, healthcare professionals, and researchers, shared experiences and concerns.

Panelists, including Neel Kanaujiya, Urmi Jhadhav, and Kris Chudwala, highlighted issues like colonial healthcare practices, discrimination, and inaccessible aid.





Group discussions identified key areas for improvement: psychosocial care provision, provider training, and emergency relief measures.

Susmit from Mist LGBTQI+ Foundation discussion, contributed the to emphasizing the need for sensitization, community involvement in research policy development, and and accessible healthcare services. This consultation fostered connections, discussions, and a platform for TGD individuals to voice concerns and suggestions.
