Indian Coming Out Day Celebrated Nationwide with

Symbolic Gatherings

Pune, July 2, 2025 – Mist LGBTQ Foundation led heartfelt celebrations of Indian Coming Out Day across India, uniting queer voices in Pune, Jammu & Kashmir, Kanpur, and Dibrugarh. The day marks the anniversary of the landmark 2009 Delhi High Court verdict that first read down Section 377, affirming dignity and freedom for LGBTQIA+ communities.

In Pune, Mist LGBTQ Foundation hosted a symbolic gathering at Kalakar Katta, FC Road. The evening began with a balloon release ceremony, followed by an open circle where participants shared personal journeys of coming out.

In Jammu & Kashmir, the LGBTQI+ Collective J&K created a rare safe space through a community circle, poetry, and a balloon release — an act especially powerful in a region where queer visibility remains scarce. Kanpur witnessed a vibrant event at Chai Sutta Bar, Saket Nagar, organised by the Kanpur Queer Welfare Foundation in collaboration with Mist. Founders Mx. Anuj Pandey and Mr. Ahsan Ansari emphasised the importance of visibility, acceptance, and solidarity.
